It designates as major substantive rules any rules adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection to identify products by category or use that may not be sold, offered for sale or distributed for sale in this State if they contain intentionally added PFAS. It clarifies the scope of the PFAS source reduction program proposed in the bill and provides that the department is required to implement the program only to the extent funds are available to do so. It makes other technical changes and clarifications to the bill.
