33 SUMMARY

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This amendment strikes the resolve and replaces it with a resolve that requires the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to convene a stakeholder group to review and recommend a comprehensive overhaul and modernization of the subdivision laws in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, chapter 206-A; Title 30-A, chapter 187, subchapter 4; and Title 38, chapter 3, subchapter 1, article 6. The amendment lists the minimum membership requirements for the stakeholder group. The department is required

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1	to submit a report to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over subdivision review matters under those laws by December 6, 2025.
