COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “ ” to H.P. 1177, L.D. 1588, “Resolve, To Convene a Working Group To Identify and Find Replacements for Certain Stigmatizing References throughout the Maine Revised Statutes and Government Publications”

Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'Resolve, To Replace Certain Stigmatizing Language in the Maine Revised Statutes with Respectful Language'**

Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

**'Sec. 1. Identification of stigmatizing language; substitution of respectful language. Resolved:** That the Revisor of Statutes shall review the Maine Revised Statutes, Titles 22, 22-A, 25 and 34-A for stigmatizing language in the laws governing the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Corrections. The Revisor of Statutes shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety by January 15, 2022 and shall provide draft legislation to amend the laws of the 3 departments in the Titles identified to change stigmatizing language as described in this section to respectful language. The Revisor of Statutes shall recommend editing the laws as necessary to accommodate singular and plural forms, masculine and feminine forms and adult and minor forms and, when possible, shall use so-called person-first language. The stigmatizing language to be changed includes "prisoner," "inmate" and "convict," which must be changed to "resident of a correctional facility" or "resident of a jail"; "drug user," which must be changed to "person who uses drugs"; "probationer," which must be changed to "client of the Department of Corrections"; and "mentally ill person," which must be changed to "person with a mental illness."

**Sec. 2. Legislation. Resolved:** That based on the report from the Revisor of Statutes pursuant to section 1, the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety may report out legislation to change stigmatizing language in the Maine Revised Statutes, Titles 22, 22-A, 25 and 34-A to respectful language and direct the Department of Health and Human Services, Department of Public Safety and Department of Corrections

19 **SUMMARY**

20 This amendment is the majority report of the committee. This amendment replaces the  
21 title and resolve. The amendment directs the Revisor of Statutes to review the Maine  
22 Revised Statutes, Titles 22, 22-A, 25 and 34-A for stigmatizing language in the laws  
23 governing the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Public Safety  
24 and the Department of Corrections and to report to the Joint Standing Committee on  
25 Criminal Justice and Public Safety by January 15, 2022 with draft legislation to amend the  
26 laws of the 3 departments to change stigmatizing language as specified to respectful  
27 language also as specified. The amendment authorizes the Joint Standing Committee on  
28 Criminal Justice and Public Safety to report out legislation to change stigmatizing language  
29 in Titles 22, 22-A, 25 and 34-A to respectful language and direct the Department of Health  
30 and Human Services, Department of Public Safety and Department of Corrections to amend  
31 their rules, policies, procedures, forms and publications to conform to the respectful  
32 language that is adopted by the Legislature. The amendment also adds an appropriations  
33 and allocations section.
