23 24 25 26 27	This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, requires the Governor to convene the Legislature before the 20th day following issuance of an emergency order if the emergency order is to be in effect for longer than 30 days. The amendment removes the provision in the bill that an emergency order may extend indefinitely if the Legislature is unable to meet in person or remotely.
