It clarifies the provisions regarding cannabis delivery transactions and specified events to allow licensees to use the tracking system established by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Office of Cannabis Policy to track delivery transactions and sales at specified events in the same manner as transactions conducted within a cannabis store.				
24	2. It removes the provisions of the bill that eliminate cannabis purchase limits.				
25 26 27	3. It clarifies that a natural person licensed under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 28-B or a principal, contractor, employee or other support staff of the licensee must be on the licensee's premises at all times.
