15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	The Maine Pilotage Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004-A, subsection 40, consists of 7 members who are citizens of the United States and the State of Maine appointed by the Governor as follows: Three licensed pilots who are actively piloting, one member from each of the coastal zones; 2 members who are not licensed pilots but are from a maritime industry that utilizes the services of pilots; <u>one member who is not a licensed pilot but has a maritime background, from a list of qualified potential appointees provided by the mayor of the City of Portland and the mayor of the City of South Portland; and 2 members <u>one member</u> representing the public who are <u>is</u> not <u>a</u> licensed <u>pilots pilot</u> but <u>have has</u> a maritime background. Appointments are for 3-year terms. Appointments of members must comply with Title 10, section 8009. The members of the commission are entitled to compensation according to Title 5, chapter 379.</u>

33 34	This amendment updates the membership of the Maine Pilotage Commission. It requires one member, rather than 2 members, of the public who is not a licensed pilot but

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has a maritime background. It also requires one member who is not a licensed pilot but has 1

2 a maritime background, from a list of qualified potential appointees provided by the mayor

of the City of Portland and the mayor of the City of South Portland. The amendment 3

- specifies the Maine Pilotage Commission is required to make just and reasonable pilotage 4 rates.
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
