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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, removes the increased 27 fees for medical and dental services and requires that those fees go only toward payment 28 of medical care support workers. The amendment requires the Department of Corrections 29 to convene a working group to study and review all financial assessments made on 30 correctional facility clients and to submit a report by January 1, 2026 to the Joint Standing 31 Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety, which may report out legislation to the 32 33 Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature. The amendment also adds an 34 appropriations and allocations section.
