242526	2. Modification to list. The commissioner may recommend to the Legislature that a marine species designated as a state endangered or state threatened species be removed from the list in section 6975 or recommend other changes to that list.

Prior to recommending to the Legislature an addition, deletion or other change to the list of state endangered and state threatened marine species in section 6975, the commissioner shall provide for public notice and public hearings on that proposed recommendation in accordance with the provisions of Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2 2-A.

§12803. Designation of state endangered and state threatened species

- 1. Standards. The commissioner shall recommend to the Legislature a species to be listed as <u>state</u> endangered or <u>state</u> threatened <u>under subsection 3</u> whenever the commissioner finds one of the following to exist:
 - A. The present or threatened destruction, modification or curtailment of its habitat or range;
 - B. Overutilization for commercial, sporting, scientific, educational or other purposes;
- C. Disease or predation;

- D. Inadequacy of existing regulatory mechanisms; or
 - E. Other natural or manmade factors affecting its continued existence within the State.
- **2. Commissioner's duties.** In recommending to the Legislature a species to be listed as <u>state</u> endangered or <u>state</u> threatened <u>under subsection 3</u>, the commissioner shall:
 - A. Make use of the best scientific, commercial and other data available;
 - B. Consult, as appropriate, with federal agencies, other interested state agencies, other states having a common interest in the species and interested persons and organizations; and
 - C. Maintain a list of all species that the Legislature has designated to be <u>state</u> endangered or <u>state</u> threatened, naming each species by both its scientific and common name, if any, and specifying over what portion of its range each species so designated is <u>state</u> endangered or <u>state</u> threatened.
 - 3. Legislative authority <u>List</u>. The Legislature, as sole authority, shall designate a species as a state endangered or state threatened species. 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1	SUMMARY
2	This amendment replaces the bill and does the following:
3 4 5 6 7	1. Requires the Commissioner of Marine Resources to designate a marine species as a state endangered or state threatened species if the species is listed as an endangered or threatened species under the United States Endangered Species Act of 1973, the species uses the waters of the State for any part of its life cycle and the species is not already so designated in state law or rule;
8 9 10 11 12	2. Requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to designate a species as a state endangered or state threatened species if the species is listed as an endangered of threatened species under the United States Endangered Species Act of 1973, the species uses the land or waters of the State for any part of its life cycle and the species is not already so designated in state law or rule;
13 14	3. Removes provisions of law that provide that the Legislature is the sole authority to designate species as state endangered or state threatened; and
15 16 17	4. Authorizes the Commissioner of Marine Resources and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to recommend additional species to the Legislature for listing as endangered or threatened species, as in current law.
