COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “ ” to S.P. 346, L.D. 787, “An Act to Create the New Maine Resident Service Coordination Program in the Department of Economic and Community Development”

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

Sec. 2. Report required. No later than January 1, 2024, the Department of Economic and Community Development shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business on its progress in establishing the New Maine Resident Service Coordination Program under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 13056-K and include any recommendations the department has for improving the program, including, but not limited to, whether the program should be administered by another state entity. The committee may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature based on the recommendations in the report.
