17 18	Whereas, the effective date for acts and resolves of the Legislature is likely to be in early October; and
19 20	Whereas, the report required by this legislation must be submitted by December 3, 2025; and
21 22	Whereas, the working group established by this legislation needs sufficient time in which to complete its work; and

30 31	<b>Sec. 2. Working group membership. Resolved:</b> That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the working group consists of 12 members appointed as follows:

The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the working group. If 30 days or more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the working group to meet and conduct its business.

Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the working group, except 12 that Legislative Council staff support is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular 13 14 or special session. 15 Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 3, 2025, the working group shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including 16 suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs and 17 the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. The amendment establishes a working group to review the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 8, 28 chapter 11, which governs harness racing, and prepare a partial or complete revision of that 29 30 chapter and any other sections of law reasonably related to harness racing in the State as may be necessary to modernize and sustain the sport of harness racing and to provide 31 32 support for gambling addiction.
