subsidy to a person who purchases timber, the person shall give preference to timber harvested in the State by an in-state contractor, as long as the price, fitness and quality of the timber is equal to that of timber harvested outside the State. The Superior Court, upon an action brought by the Attorney General, may assess against a person who violates this subsection a civil penalty of \$250 for each violation. Each load of timber delivered pursuant to a purchase made in violation of this subsection constitutes a separate violation.'

14 SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment changes certain terminology and definitions in the bill to clarify the types of wood to which the provisions of the bill apply. The amendment replaces the terms "lumber" and "solid wood products" in the bill with the term "timber," which is further defined as "roundwood," meaning logs, bolts and other round sections of wood, and "residue," meaning by-products of a processed log. The amendment also adds a reference to state contracts for timber harvesting.
