38 39	This amendment, which is the unanimous report of the committee, removes th sections of the bill that decriminalize the crimes of furnishing or possessing hypodermi			

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apparatuses. It removes the changes to the requirement to distribute educational
materials. It removes the requirement to distribute naloxone hydrochloride and other
safer drug use supplies. Instead of requiring that a hypodermic apparatus exchange
program have a board, the amendment requires a program to have a process or system to
regularly seek input from persons with a history of drug use. The amendment also make
changes to the allocation of funds appropriated for hypodermic apparatus exchange
programs. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
