2	This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft. The amendment provides
3	that the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Alcoholic
4	Beverages and Lottery Operations may license up to 11 agency liquor stores in a
5	municipality with a population over 60,000. Under current law, the maximum number of
6	agency liquor stores that may be licensed in a municipality with a population over 45,000
7	is 10.
