4	This amendment provides that the Gagetown Harmful Chemical Study Commission
5	reestablished in the bill may, rather than must, request information it determines necessary
6	to complete the study of the effects of exposure to harmful chemicals on individuals who
7	trained at the Canadian military support base in Gagetown, New Brunswick, Canada as a
8	member of the United States Armed Forces, as a member of the reserve component of the
9	United States Armed Forces or as a member of the National Guard of any state from the
10	United States Department of Defense and other federal agencies. The amendment removes
11	the provision in the bill directing the study commission to provide medical testing to
12	identify effects of exposure to harmful chemicals to individuals identified through that
13	information. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
