COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “ ” to H.P. 180, L.D. 259, “An Act To Improve Solid Waste Management”

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act To Increase Waste Handling Fees Imposed on the Landfilling of Municipal Solid Waste and Construction and Demolition Debris'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §2203-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2021, c. 230, §1, is further amended to read:

1. Fees. Unless otherwise provided by rule adopted in accordance with subsection 3, fees are imposed in the following amounts to be levied for solid waste that is disposed of at commercial, municipal, state-owned and regional association landfills.

Asbestos	\$5 per cubic yard
Oil-contaminated soil, gravel, brick, concrete and other aggregate	\$25 per ton
Waste water facility sludge	\$5 per ton
Ash, coal and oil	\$5 per ton
Paper mill sludge	\$5 per ton
Industrial waste	\$5 per ton
Sandblast grit	\$5 per ton
All other special waste	\$5 per ton

30 **SUMMARY**

31 This amendment, which is a minority report of the committee, changes the title and
 32 replaces the bill, which is a concept draft. It amends waste handling fees to, beginning
 33 August 1, 2023, increase the fee imposed on the disposal at a landfill of municipal solid
 34 waste and municipal solid waste ash from \$1 per ton to \$2 per ton and increase the fee
 35 imposed on the disposal at a landfill of construction and demolition debris and residue from
 36 the processing of construction and demolition debris from \$2 per ton to \$3 per ton.
