Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 23 members as follows. 25 26 1. The President of the Senate shall appoint one member of the Senate and the Speaker 27 of the House shall appoint 2 members of the House of Representatives, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature.
