3	SUMMARY
4 5 6 7 8 9	This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment removes the requirement in the bill that all school administrative units provide training in de-escalation and behavior intervention to each of its administrators, teachers and education technicians. The amendment retains the requirement in the bill that the Department of Education convene a group of teachers and experts in de-escalation and behavior intervention to develop best practices for training to be distributed to all school administrative units.
