The amendment instead, for fiscal years 2024-25 and 13 2025-26, requires the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future to coordinate a process to direct to the Maine Apprenticeship Program 1% of all funding that has been or will be 14 received pursuant to the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, the federal 15 Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, the federal CHIPS Act of 2022 and any other federal law 16 providing new or expanded funding that is available on or after July 1, 2024 for workforce 17 18 development activities or for the creation of high-wage, in-demand jobs in apprenticeable 19 occupations. The funding directed to the Maine Apprenticeship Program may not exceed 20 \$12,000,000.
