1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1770,</b> as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, §2, is amended to read:
4	§1770. Penalties
5 6 7 8 9	1. General penalty. Notwithstanding Title 17-A, and unless otherwise specified, a violation of this chapter is a Class E crime, punishable by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both, except that a violation of this subchapter is punishable by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for the first offense and a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$250 for each subsequent offense.
11 12 13 14	<b>2. Traffic infraction.</b> A violation of the rules adopted by the Chief of the State Police pertaining to this subchapter is a traffic infraction subject to a <u>forfeiture fine</u> of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for the first offense and a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$250 for each subsequent offense.

16 17 This bill revises the fines for a violation of the laws governing inspection of motor vehicles and removes imprisonment as a penalty.
