1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 15 MRSA c. 107 is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 107
4	CUSTODY AND EXAMINATION OF SEXUALLY EXPLICIT MATERIAL
5	§1121. Limitations on examination of sexually explicit material
6 7	1. Sexually explicit material. For purposes of this section, "sexually explicit material" means the property or material described in Title 17-A, chapter 12.
8	2. Custody of sexually explicit material. Sexually explicit material subject to a
9	criminal investigation or proceeding must remain in the care, custody and control of the
10	attorney for the State or the court. Notwithstanding provisions of the Maine Rules of
11	Criminal Procedure, Rule 16 to the contrary, in any criminal proceeding the attorney for
12 13	the State may not release to the defendant a copy, photograph, duplicate or any other reproduction of any sexually explicit material, as long as the attorney for the State makes
13	the sexually explicit material reasonably available to the defendant.

15	3. Reasonably available. For purposes of this section, sexually explicit material is
16	determined to be reasonably available to the defendant if the attorney for the State
17	provides ample opportunity for inspection, viewing and examination of the sexually
18	explicit material at a location within the control of the attorney for the State by the
19	defendant, the defendant's attorney or any person whom the defendant may seek to
20	qualify to furnish expert testimony at trial.
21	SUMMARY
22	This bill creates new guidelines for access to sexually explicit material in a criminal
23	investigation or proceeding. This material is now accessible to defendants pursuant to
24	Maine Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 16, which permits copying or photographing.
25	This bill authorizes reasonable access for inspection of the sexually explicit material but
26	prohibits any reproduction of the material and requires that it be inspected in a facility
27	under the control of the attorney for the State. The custody, control and care of the
28	material must remain with the attorney for the State or the court. This bill is consistent
29	with the federal requirements of custody and treatment of evidence of child pornography
30	pursuant to the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, Public Law 109-
