An Act to Clarify the Process for Admission to the Bar on Motion

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 4 MRSA §805-A, sub-§3,** as corrected by RR 2021, c. 1, Pt. B, §23, is amended to read:
- 3. Admission within one year of passing bar examination. The <u>An</u> applicant <u>for admission by examination</u> must be admitted to practice within one year from the <u>time date</u> that the applicant has been notified of that applicant's passing of the bar examination. This one-year period may be <u>enlarged extended</u> by successive one-year periods by a Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court on motion for good cause shown during the period.

## Sec. 2. 4 MRSA §805-A, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

4. Admission within one year of applying for admission on motion. An applicant for admission on motion must be admitted to practice within one year from the date that the board of bar examiners receives the applicant's application. This period may be extended by a 6-month period by the board of bar examiners pursuant to the regulations of the board of bar examiners and then by successive one-year periods by a Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court on motion for good cause shown during the 6-month period or any succeeding one-year period.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies that an applicant for the bar by admission on motion must be admitted to practice within one year of the date the board of bar examiners receives the application for admission on motion.
