An Act To Implement a Moratorium on Metallic Mineral Mining

- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- 3 **Whereas,** the statutory provisions of the Maine Metallic Mineral Mining Act took 4 effect on June 1, 2014 without the corresponding regulatory framework in place as 5 directed under Public Law 2011, chapter 653; and
- 6 **Whereas,** without the corresponding regulatory framework in place, the State is at 7 risk for litigation based on inconsistencies between the current statutory and regulatory 8 frameworks for metallic mineral mining; and
- 9 Whereas, implementation of a moratorium on the issuance of a mining permit under 10 the Maine Metallic Mineral Mining Act provides the State with the time necessary to 11 address these inconsistencies; and
- 12 **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 13 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 14 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 15 therefore,
- 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 17 Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §490-UU is enacted to read:

## 18 §490-UU. Moratorium

- Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the department may not
  issue a mining permit under this article until this section is repealed.
- 21 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 22 legislation takes effect when approved.
- 23 SUMMARY
- This bill implements a moratorium on metallic mineral mining in the State by prohibiting the Department of Environmental Protection from issuing a permit to mine under the Maine Metallic Mineral Mining Act.
