Amend the amendment in the first paragraph after the title in the first line (page 1, line 11 in amendment) by striking out the following: "the title and before the enacting clause the following:" and inserting the following: 'section 1 the following:'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the mandate preamble (page 1, lines 12 to 16 in amendment) and inserting the following:

**'Sec. 2. Reimbursement.** The Department of Education shall develop a process to provide reimbursement to school administrative units that serve students in grades 6 to 12 for the cost of making menstrual products available to students at no cost in all school bathrooms.

**Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Menstrual Products Reimbursement N391**

Initiative: Provides ongoing funds to reimburse school administrative units that serve students in grades 6 to 12 for the cost of making menstrual products available to students at no cost in all school bathrooms.
