11	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
12 13	'Resolve, To Create a Working Group To Develop Solutions To Meet the Needs for Municipal Volunteer Personnel'
14 15	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and inserting the following:
16 17	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
18 19 20	Whereas, the Municipal Volunteer Working Group established in this resolve will make important recommendations regarding ways to recruit, train and retain essential volunteer firefighters and emergency medical services personnel; and
21 22 23	Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report produced in time for submission to the next legislative session; and
24 25 26 27	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
28 29 30	Sec. 1. Municipal Volunteer Working Group established. Resolved: That the Municipal Volunteer Working Group, referred to in this resolve as "the working group," is established; and be it further
31 32	<b>Sec. 2. Working group membership. Resolved:</b> That the working group consists of 9 members appointed as follows:

1 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, one from the party with the greatest number of members and one from the party with the 2nd 2 greatest number of members; 3 4 2. Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House, at least one of whom is from the party with the greatest number of members and 5 at least one of whom is from the party with the 2nd greatest number of members; 6 7 3. One representative from the Maine State Federation of Firefighters, appointed by 8 the President of the Senate; 9 4. One volunteer firefighter or emergency responder who may be active or nonactive, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 10 5. One chief of a volunteer fire department, appointed by the President of the Senate; 11 12 and 6. One representative from the Maine Fire Chiefs' Association, appointed by the 13 14 Speaker of the House; and be it further Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate 15 chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the 16 17 working group; and be it further Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of working group. Resolved: That all 18 19 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 20 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, 21 the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the working group. If 30 days or 22 23 more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant 24 25 authority for the working group to meet and conduct its business; and be it further 26 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the working group shall find solutions to the recruitment, training and retention problems facing volunteer fire departments and 27 28 volunteer emergency medical services providers in Maine. 29 The working group shall solicit input from municipalities with volunteer fire departments and volunteer emergency medical services, volunteer firefighters and 30 volunteer emergency medical services providers and members of the public. 31 The working group shall identify the reasons for recruitment, training and retention problems 32 33 and recommend solutions: and be it further 34 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide 35 necessary staffing services to the working group; and be it further Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 2, 2015, the working 36 group shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including 37 suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public 38

suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public
Safety. The committee may submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular
Session of the 127th Legislature.
