The study must include an economic evaluation of commuter and passenger train service along the corridor route and any analysis necessary to secure potential funding sources identified in the Lewiston-Auburn Passenger Rail Service Plan report published May 2019. The department shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by February 1, 2021. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters may submit a bill to the First Regular Session of the 130th Legislature based on the findings provided in the department's report.

The total cost of the study must be determined by the department. One third of the costs of the study must come from the Multimodal Transportation Fund established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 4210-B and 2/3 of the costs must be provided by municipalities that would be directly impacted by commuter and passenger train service between Portland and the Lewiston and Auburn area and private entities interested in commuter and passenger train service between Portland and the Lewiston and Auburn area. 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funds may be collected by or transferred to the department for the purpose of conducting 1 the study unless the department receives commitments from the municipalities and 2 private entities sufficient to fund 2/3 of the costs of the study.  study for commuter and passenger train service between Portland and the Lewiston and
 Auburn area.
- 32 2. It requires the department to submit a report to the joint standing committee of the
 33 Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by February 1, 2021.
- 34 3. It allows the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
 35 transportation matters to submit a bill to the First Regular Session of the 130th
 36 Legislature based on the findings provided in the department's report.
- 4. It requires that 1/3 of the costs of the study must come from the Multimodal
 Transportation Fund under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 4210-B and 2/3
 of the costs must be provided by municipalities that would be directly impacted by the

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commuter and passenger train service and private entities interested in the commuter and
 passenger train service.

5. It provides that no funds may be transferred to the department for the purpose of conducting the study unless the department receives commitments from the municipalities and private entities sufficient to fund 2/3 of the costs of the study.

6 6. It provides that if municipalities and private entities have not committed to 7 providing the required funding for the study by August 1, 2020, the department is not 8 authorized to accept any funds or conduct the study.
