An Act To Create an Apprentice Trapper License

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §12204** is enacted to read:

3 **§12204. Apprentice trapper license**

4 **1. Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the
5 following terms have the following meanings.

6 A. "In the presence of" means in visual and voice contact without the use of visual or
7 audio enhancement devices, including binoculars and citizen band radios.

8 B. "Supervisor" means a person who is 18 years of age or older, has held a valid
9 trapping license under this subchapter for 3 consecutive years and is trapping with a
10 person holding an apprentice trapper license.

11 **2. Supervisor required.** A holder of an apprentice trapper license may not trap
12 other than in the presence of a supervisor.

13 **3. Supervisor responsibility.** A supervisor shall ensure that the holder of an
14 apprentice trapper license follows safe and ethical trapping protocol and adheres to the
15 laws under this Part. A supervisor may not intentionally permit a person trapping under
16 an apprentice trapper license with that supervisor to violate subsection 2.

17 **4. Eligibility.** A resident or nonresident 16 years of age or older who has never held
18 a valid trapping license or junior trapping license in this State, or any other state, province
19 or country, is eligible to obtain an apprentice trapper license, except that a person may not
20 be issued an apprentice trapper license after having previously held an apprentice trapper
21 license under this section. A person is eligible to obtain an apprentice trapper license
22 without having successfully completed a trapper education course as described in section
23 10108, subsection 7.

24 **5. Expiration of apprentice trapper license.** An apprentice trapper license is valid
25 for up to 12 calendar months and expires on June 30th.

26 **6. Issuance; fee.** The commissioner, through the commissioner's authorized agent,
27 shall issue an apprentice trapper license to an eligible person. The fee for an apprentice
28 trapper license is \$35 for residents and \$317 for nonresidents.

29 **7. Restrictions.** The holder of an apprentice trapper license is not eligible to obtain
30 a permit to trap for bear under section 12260-A.

31 **8. Penalties.** The following penalties apply to violations of this section.

32 A. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a fine of
33 not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 may be adjudged.

34 B. A person who violates this section after having been adjudicated as having
35 committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within the previous 5-year period
36 commits a Class E crime.

SUMMARY

This bill creates an apprentice trapper license. An apprentice trapper license allows a person who has never held a trapping license to go trapping with an experienced trapper for up to one year without having to take a trapper education course. The holder of an apprentice trapper license must, while trapping, be under the direct supervision of an experienced trapper at all times. An apprentice trapper license allows a person to trap for all species that may be legally trapped, except black bear. The fee for an apprentice trapper license is the same as for a regular trapping license.
