1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §709, sub-§2,</b> ¶¶ <b>J and K,</b> as enacted by PL 2011, c. 629 §15, are amended to read:
4	J. Providing samples authorized under section 1355-A, 1402, 1402-A or 1504; or
5	K. Donations authorized under section 708-B-; or
6	Sec. 2. 28-A MRSA §709, sub-§2, ¶L is enacted to read:
7	L. Licensees offering complimentary samples of wine under section 1055.
8	Sec. 3. 28-A MRSA §1055 is enacted to read:
9	§1055. Wine samples at restaurants
10 11 12	1. Wine samples at restaurants. A restaurant, Class A restaurant or Class A restaurant/lounge may offer a complimentary sample of wine to a customer, subject to the following conditions:
13	A. A sample may not be given to a person under 21 years of age;
14 15 16	B. A person may not be served more than a total of 5 ounces of wine having ar alcohol content of 14% or less or more than a total of 3 ounces of wine having an alcohol content greater than 14%;
17	C. A person who is visibly intoxicated may not be served;
18 19	D. The wine sampling must be conducted within the hours of retail sale for liquor established in this Title;
20	E. The wine sampling must take place on the licensed premises; and
21	F. Wine served as a wine sample must be purchased from a wholesale licensee.
22	SUMMARY
23 24	This bill allows a restaurant, Class A restaurant or Class A restaurant/lounge to offer complimentary samples of wine to a customer subject to certain conditions.
