## An Act Regarding Low Success Rates for Moose Hunting

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11552, sub-§2,** as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:
- **2. Moose management.** To effectively manage the moose herd in the State, the commissioner may by rule establish:
  - A. The number of moose permits to be issued every year, including a percentage for antlerless moose;
  - B. The length of the moose hunting season; and
  - C. The timing of the moose hunting season-; and
  - D. The adjustment of the moose hunting season in each wildlife management district based on the success rate for moose hunting in that district, such that wildlife management districts 7 and 8 each have 2 independent moose hunting seasons, one in September and one in October.
- **Sec. 2. Rules.** The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall adopt rules specifying when each wildlife management district will be open for moose hunting under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 11552, such that if a district had a less than 50% success rate for moose hunts over 2 consecutive seasons, the district must begin its open hunting season in the first week of the moose hunting season. Wildlife management districts 7 and 8 must each have 2 independent moose hunting seasons, one in September and one in October. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

22 SUMMARY

This bill requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, when establishing rules that manage moose hunting seasons, to take into consideration the moose hunting success rate of each wildlife management district when establishing the beginning date for moose hunting in that district. The bill also directs the commissioner to establish 2 independent moose hunting seasons in wildlife management districts 7 and 8.
