- 'Sec. 2. Department of Health and Human Services; community-based education and outreach program relating to female genital mutilation. The Department of Health and Human Services shall establish a community-based education and outreach program to provide culturally specific services for communities in the State in which female genital mutilation of minors might be practiced. Services to be provided under the program include, but are not limited to:
- 1. Development and distribution of educational materials regarding the health risks and emotional trauma inflicted by and relating to the practice of female genital mutilation;
- 2. Development and distribution of educational materials relating to the federal prohibition on and penalties for female genital mutilation of a minor under 18 United States Code, Section 116, the state prohibition on and penalties for female genital mutilation of a minor under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, section 214 and the mandatory reporting requirements relating to female genital mutilation of a minor pursuant to Title 22, section 4011-A, subsection 1;
- 3. Outreach and provision of culturally specific support services to victims of female genital mutilation in the State; and
- 4. Development and administration of a culturally sensitive professional training program relating to female genital mutilation that includes, but is not limited to, training on the information described in subsections 1 and 2.

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20 SUMMARY

This amendment, which is a minority report of the committee, elevates from Class B to Class A the new crime of performing female genital mutilation on a female person under 18 years of age. The amendment reduces from a Class B to a Class C crime the first offense of a parent, guardian or custodian of the female person under 18 years of age in consenting to or permitting the procedure but retains as a Class B crime any subsequent offenses. The amendment provides a defense to the new crime of female genital mutilation that, when the procedure was consented to or permitted by a parent, guardian or custodian of a female person under 18 years of age, the parent, guardian or custodian was compelled to consent to or permit the procedure by force or by threat of death or bodily injury to that person or another person.

The amendment also directs the Department of Health and Human Services to develop, establish and administer a community-based education and outreach program to provide culturally specific services for communities in the State in which female genital mutilation of minors might be practiced, including a culturally sensitive professional training program, and provides funding to implement the program.
