Resolve, To Ensure That Maine Teachers and Paraprofessionals Who Work with Children with Autism Spectrum Disorders Are Highly Qualified

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- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- 3 **Whereas,** it is vital to ensure children with autism spectrum disorders in our schools 4 achieve the best educational outcomes possible; and
- 5 **Whereas,** it is necessary to ensure as soon as practicable that teachers of children 6 with autism spectrum disorders are highly qualified; and
- 7 **Whereas,** this legislation provides a means to ensure teachers of children with 8 autism spectrum disorders are highly qualified; and

9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 12 therefore, be it

13 Sec. 1. Department of Education to study teachers and paraprofessionals who work with children with autism spectrum disorders. Resolved: That the 14 Department of Education shall conduct a study to ensure that teachers and 15 paraprofessionals who work with children with autism spectrum disorders are highly 16 17 qualified. The department shall convene a work group with broad stakeholder representation. The purpose of the work group is to analyze the qualifications of teachers 18 19 and paraprofessionals who work with children with autism spectrum disorders and to 20 make recommendations that will assist the department in ensuring that the teachers and 21 paraprofessionals are highly qualified. The work group shall:

- Examine and recommend the minimum level of competencies that regular
 educators, special educators and paraprofessionals need to provide educational services to
 students with autism spectrum disorders;
- 25 2. Examine and recommend a specific curriculum that regular and special education 26 teachers must complete for certification in order to be considered a highly qualified 27 teacher for students with autism spectrum disorders;
- 28 3. Examine and recommend specific guidelines for paraprofessional supervision,
 29 including, but not limited to, daily progress monitoring, problem solving and philosophy;
- 4. Develop a plan that will phase in a new paraprofessional structure, including basic
 education technician I, II and III certifications, and create a concentrated and specialized
 certification for working with students with autism spectrum disorders; and
- 5. Define a designation for a paraprofessional to be considered highly qualified to
 provide special education services; and be it further

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the work group under section 1 shall submit its
 recommendations to the Department of Education by November 1, 2011. The department
 shall submit a report, including the findings and recommendations from the work group,
 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by December 7, 2011,

and the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs is authorized to
 introduce legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 125th Legislature.

3 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 4 legislation takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

6 This resolve requires the Department of Education to convene a work group to 7 conduct a study to ensure that teachers and paraprofessionals who work with children with autism spectrum disorders are highly qualified. The work group is required to 8 9 submit its recommendations to the department by November 1, 2011. The department is required to submit a report, including the findings and recommendations from the work 10 group, to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by December 11 7, 2011, and the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs is 12 13 authorized to introduce legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 125th 14 Legislature.
