**Resolve, Establishing the Study Commission To Ensure Integrity in the Use of Service Animals**

- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- 3 **Whereas,** this resolve establishes the Study Commission To Ensure Integrity in the 4 Use of Service Animals in order to study training and certification requirements of 5 service animals, methods of disseminating information about service animals to the 6 public and documentation of training and certification of service animals; and
- Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that
  the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next
  legislative session; and
- 10 **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 11 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 12 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 13 therefore, be it
- Sec. 1. Study commission established. Resolved: That the Study Commission
   To Ensure Integrity in the Use of Service Animals, referred to in this resolve as "the study
   commission," is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Study commission membership. Resolved: That the study
   commission consists of 12 members appointed as follows:
- 19 1. Three members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including 20 members from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
- 2. Four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
   House, including members from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats
   in the Legislature;
- 3. Two members who are trainers of service or therapy animals appointed by the
  President of the Senate;
- 4. One member who is a restaurant owner or operator appointed by the Speaker ofthe House;
  - 5. One member of the business community appointed by the Governor; and

- 6. One member of the Maine Human Rights Commission appointed by theGovernor; and be it further
- 31 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate 32 chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the 33 study commission; and be it further
- 34 **Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of study commission. Resolved:** That all 35 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 36 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative

- 1 Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, 2 the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the study commission. If 30 days or 3 more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have 4 been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant 5 authority for the study commission to meet and conduct its business; and be it further
- 6

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the study commission shall study:

- 7 1. Training requirements for service animals;
- 8 2. Certifying organizations and existing certification requirements and development
   9 of new state-based certification requirements, if needed;
- 10 3. The necessity of educating the public about service animals and methods of 11 disseminating information about service animals; and
- 4. Documentation of training and certification of service animals and other similar
   proofs and development of additional documentation and proofs, if needed; and be it
   further
- 15 **Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That the Legislative Council shall provide 16 necessary staffing services to the study commission; and be it further

17 **Sec. 7. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than December 2, 2015, the study 18 commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, 19 including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 20 127th Legislature.

21 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 22 legislation takes effect when approved.

This resolve establishes the Study Commission To Ensure Integrity in the Use of Service Animals in order to study training and certification requirements of service animals, methods of disseminating information about service animals to the public and documentation of training and certification of service animals.
