3	SUMMARY
4	This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Education
5	and Cultural Affairs. It changes the requirement in the bill that a school board hire a
6	professional food service director meeting certain qualifications to a requirement that a
7	school board designate a person to serve as the food service director. It directs the
8	Commissioner of Education to use existing rulemaking authority to establish
9	qualifications for a food service director. It directs the Department of Education to
10	facilitate the sharing of information among food service directors and to report to the
11	Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs on these efforts. It adds an
12	effective date of August 1, 2012 to the requirement that a school board designate a food
13	service director.
