A request for mediation does not waive any existing rights of appeal available to a pharmacy under this subsection.

The amendment provides that a pharmacy benefits manager may set a maximum allowable cost for a prescription drug only if that drug is nationally available and has 2 or more nationally available therapeutically equivalent drug substitutes with a significant cost difference rather than 3 or more as provided in the bill. The amendment also replaces the provision in the bill authorizing the Superintendent of Insurance to enforce violations with a provision granting a pharmacy the right to request mediation by a private mediator to resolve disagreements related to maximum allowable cost pricing.
30 31	The amendment specifies that the provisions apply to contracts between a pharmacy and a pharmacy benefits manager executed or renewed on or after January 1, 2016.
