	<b>RIGHTS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS</b>
<u>§6201</u>	. Definitions
Fe	or the purposes of this chapter, the following terms have the following meanings.
	<b>Law enforcement officer.</b> "Law enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in 25, section 2801 A, subsection 5.
	<b>Sexual assault counselor.</b> "Sexual assault counselor" has the same meaning as in 6, section 53-A, subsection 1, paragraph B.
<u>3.</u>	Sexual assault survivor. "Sexual assault survivor" or "survivor" means:
A	An adult who is a victim of a crime described in:
	(1) Title 17-A, chapter 11;
	(2) Title 17-A, section 511-A; or
	(3) Title 17-A, section 852 or 853; or
B	A minor who is a victim of a crime described in:
	(1) Title 17-A, chapter 11;
	(2) Title 17-A, section 511-A;
	(3) Title 17-A, section 852 or 853; or
	(4) Title 17-A, section 282 or 283.
<u>§6202</u>	. Right to a sexual assault counselor and a support person

## SUMMARY

2 This bill specifies that a sexual assault survivor has the right to consult with a sexual 3 assault counselor during any physical examination and has the right to have a sexual assault 4 counselor or support person of the survivor's choosing present during any interview by a law enforcement officer, prosecutor or defense attorney. A survivor retains this right even 5 6 if the survivor has waived the right in a previous examination or interview. The bill also 7 prohibits evidence gathered during a sexual assault forensic examination from being used 8 to prosecute a survivor for any Class D or Class E crime or for any crime under the Maine 9 Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, chapter 45. Evidence gathered during a sexual assault forensic 10 examination may also not be used as a basis to search for further evidence of any unrelated 11 Class D or Class E crime or for any crime under Title 17-A, chapter 45 that may have been 12 committed by the survivor.
