SUMMARY

23 This amendment retains the provisions of the bill but requires the Director of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and Lottery Operations within the Department of 24 25 Administrative and Financial Services to hire 5 new liquor inspectors, 3 of whom must be trained law enforcement officers. The amendment provides an appropriations and 26 allocations section to fund those positions and requires the bureau to report by March 1, 27 28 2017 on changes and enhancements to liquor enforcement efforts.
