3 4	1-A. Accelerator. "Accelerator" means a program that supports entrepreneurs by providing training, business assistance and mentors in a time-limited training program.

"Entrepreneurial support system" means a network of organizations and programs in the State that facilitate entrepreneurial growth including capital providers, chambers of commerce, local governments, economic development organizations, universities, incubators and accelerators.

May establish a program in collaboration with the University of Maine School of25Law to support the commercialization and manufacturing of innovations in the State26by providing education and assistance with the patent process of the United States27Patent and Trademark Office to companies, inventors and entrepreneurs in the State.28The administrative costs of a program under this paragraph are not management and29related operating costs of the institute under section 15305.

B. The Department of Economic and Community Development shall determine assistance criteria and desired program outcomes and establish an application process so that technology centers possessing personnel with applicable skills can be chosen to best deliver services to technology-based entrepreneurs within a respective area <u>unless the technology centers are administered by the Maine Technology Institute</u> pursuant to section 15303, subsection 6, paragraph F.

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SUMMARY

This bill expands the powers of the Maine Technology Institute by allowing the institute to establish programs that support organizations and programs in the State that facilitate entrepreneurial growth and internships with Maine's innovative businesses and protect intellectual property by the State's research institutions, companies and entrepreneurs. This bill also allows the Maine Technology Institute to administer

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- technology centers that support early-stage development of technology-based businesses that are currently administered by the Department of Economic and Community Development. 2
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
