A required component of Maine studies is Maine Native American Wabanaki studies, and Wabanaki studies may be taught as a component of other content areas, as appropriate, including but not limited to the content areas of English language arts, mathematics, science and fine arts. Maine Native American Wabanaki studies and Maine African American studies must be included in the review of content standards and performance indicators of the learning results conducted in accordance with section 6209, subsection 4. Maine Native American Wabanaki studies must address the following topics:
29 30	A. <u>Maine tribal Wabanaki</u> governments and political systems and their relationship with local, state, national and international governments;

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

1 Sec. 3. Department of Education review of content standards; Wabanaki 2 studies. The Commissioner of Education shall, in the commissioner's next regular review 3 of the content standards and performance indicators by content area pursuant to the Maine 4 Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 6209, subsection 4, consider inclusion of Wabanaki 5 studies in content areas other than social studies, as appropriate.'

6 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section 7 number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

9 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill. The 10 amendment updates the term "Maine Native American studies" with "Wabanaki studies" in the laws regarding elementary and secondary education requirements and provides that, 11 12 in addition to being a required component in Maine studies, Wabanaki studies may be 13 taught as a component in other content areas, as appropriate. The amendment also directs the Commissioner of Education to consider the inclusion of Wabanaki studies in content 14 15 areas other than social studies in the system of learning results when conducting the commissioner's next regular review of the content standards and performance indicators. 16
