22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, strikes the provision of the bill that affects the quorum requirements for the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission. It also provides staggered terms for the members of the commission appointed by the Governor by providing that, of the first 6 commission members appointed after the effective date of this legislation, 2 members must be appointed for a term of 2 years, 2 members must be appointed for a term of 3 years and 2 members must be appointed for a term of 4 years. All subsequent appointments by the Governor to the commission are for 3 years as specified in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 6212, subsection 1.
