6 7 8	L. To study jurisdictional overlap between the department's boards and commissions and other state agencies for purposes of streamlining and consolidating related legal authorities and administrative processes:
9	Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §8003, sub-§2-A, ¶¶M and N are enacted to read:

To exercise discretionary authority, after consultation with licensing boards if applicable, to review and determine on a case-by-case basis examination and licensing eligibility for applications for licensure submitted by individuals who identify themselves as veterans with military service, experience and training; and N. To exercise discretionary authority to waive examination and license fees for applicants for licensure who identify themselves as veterans with military service, experience and training.

18 19 20 21 22	This bill grants the Director of the Office of Professional and Occupational Regulation within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation the authority to modify licensing requirements of professional licensing boards administered by the Office of Professional and Occupational Regulation on a case-by-case basis for applicants for licensure who are military veterans.
