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1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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2 Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1110, sub-§§6 to 8 are enacted to read:

6. Report. A dealer shall file a quarterly report with the Attorney General listing all
current guaranteed price home heating oil, kerosene or liquefied petroleum gas contracts
under subsection 1 held by the dealer and providing evidence of compliance with
subsection 2. A dealer shall pay a filing fee of \$5 to the Attorney General when filing a
report under this subsection.

8 7. Fine. A dealer who violates a guaranteed price home heating oil, kerosene or 9 liquefied petroleum gas contract for any reason, including failing to provide the home heating oil, kerosene or liquefied petroleum gas when due or failing to reimburse in a 10 timely manner the contracting consumer the full amount of the contract in accordance 11 with subsection 5, commits a civil violation for which a fine equal to the full amount of 12 the contract plus an additional amount equal to 5% of the full amount of the contract must 13 be adjudged. The Attorney General shall collect the fine and disburse an amount equal to 14 15 the full amount of the violated contract to a consumer whose contract was violated. The Attorney General may retain the additional 5% for costs incurred in collecting the fine. 16

8. Rules. The Attorney General may adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this
section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined
by Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

SUMMARY

21 This bill requires a dealer of home heating oil, kerosene or liquefied petroleum gas to file a quarterly report with the Attorney General concerning all prepaid guaranteed price 22 23 home heating oil, kerosene or liquefied petroleum gas contracts that the dealer holds and 24 evidence that the dealer is in compliance with the security provisions under state law 25 relating to those contracts. The bill also stipulates that a violation of a prepaid guaranteed price home heating oil, kerosene or liquefied petroleum gas contract is a civil violation 26 27 with a fine to equal the amount of the contract plus an additional 5% to be collected by 28 the Attorney General. The Attorney General shall disburse a portion of the fine to the 29 consumers whose contracts were not honored.
