Resolve, to Improve Access to Appropriate Levels of Long-term Care by Rebasing and Increasing Reimbursement Rates

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

**Whereas,** this legislation requires changes to certain MaineCare reimbursement rates and requires these changes to take effect July 1, 2023; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to rebase reimbursement rates. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Health and Human Services shall rebase reimbursement rates, effective July 1, 2023, to reflect the increased costs experienced by nursing facilities, including, but not limited to, the cost of labor.
- Sec. 2. Department of Health and Human Services to establish enhanced reimbursement rate. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend its rules in Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 67, Principles of Reimbursement for Nursing Facilities, Section 22.3.3.4 to provide that, effective July 1, 2023, the upper limit on the base year case mix and regionally adjusted cost per day is the median multiplied by 130%.
- Sec. 3. Department of Health and Human Services to improve access to nursing facilities for patients with special needs. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall work with nursing facilities to improve access to the facilities for patients with special needs, including, but not limited to, bariatric patients, patients in need of dialysis treatment, patients undergoing cancer treatment or long-term infusion therapy and patients with behavioral health needs.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

28 SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Department of Health and Human Services to:

- 1. Rebase reimbursement rates, effective July 1, 2023, to reflect the increased costs experienced by nursing facilities;
- 2. Amend its rules in Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 67, Principles of Reimbursement for Nursing Facilities to provide that, effective July 1, 2023, the upper limit on the base year case mix and regionally adjusted cost per day is the median multiplied by 130%; and
- 3. Work with nursing facilities to improve access to the facilities for patients with certain special needs.
