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Amend the bill in section 9 in subsection 6-A by striking out all of paragraph B (page
3, lines 18 to 25 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

If the department determines that a program has failed to make adequate progress toward achieving the program's performance goals described in the approved product 4 stewardship plan pursuant to subsection 5, paragraph J, the department shall notify 5 the producer or stewardship organization operating the program in writing regarding 6 its determination and may direct the producer or stewardship organization to 7 implement specific changes to the plan within 6 months of the written notification, 8 which may include, but are not limited to, improvements to the convenience of the 9 collection system or to the education and outreach efforts under the program to 10 improve program performance. The department may also recommend in its annual 11 12 report under section 1772, subsection 1 that the program be amended to require financial incentives or, if appropriate for the product, implementation of a deposit and 13 14 refund system.'

Amend the bill in section 10 in subsection 7 in paragraph A in the first line (page 3, line 33 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "site" and inserting the following: 'location'

Amend the bill in section 10 in subsection 7 in paragraph D in the 3rd line (page 4, line 1 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Every 2 years, the" and inserting the following: 'Every 2 years, the <u>The</u>'

Amend the bill in section 10 in subsection 7 in paragraph F in the first line (page 4, line 7 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "program" the following: 'and to the approved goals for the program'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

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This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, amends the bill as follows.

**SUMMARY** 

It amends program staffing requirements to allow the Commissioner of
Environmental Protection to approve a lesser staffing requirement than the minimum
half-time employee required under the bill.

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2. It authorizes the Department of Environmental Protection to recommend in its
32 annual report to the Legislature that a program be required to provide financial incentives
33 or a deposit and refund system.

34 3. It makes a number of other technical changes to the bill.

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
