1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §909 is enacted to read:
3	§909. Fraudulent claim of affiliation with a federally recognized tribe
4 5	1. A person is guilty of fraudulent claim of affiliation with a federally recognized tribe if the person:
6	A. Knowingly claims falsely to be affiliated with a federally recognized tribe;
7 8	B. Has the intent to obtain by making the claim under paragraph A something of value to which the person is not entitled; and
9 10	C. Obtains by making the claim under paragraph A something of value to which the person is not entitled.
11	2. Fraudulent claim of affiliation with a federally recognized tribe is a Class E crime.
12	SUMMARY
13 14 15 16	This bill creates the crime of fraudulent claim of affiliation with a federally recognized tribe for when a person knowingly claims falsely to be affiliated with a federally recognized tribe with the intent to obtain, and does obtain, something of value to which the person is not entitled.
