More Publicly Funded Students Meet Certain Requirements**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRS §2951, sub-§6**, as repealed and replaced by PL 2017, c. 342,  
3 §2, is amended to read:

4 **6. Student assessment and other requirements.** ~~Meets~~ At a minimum, meets or  
5 exceeds the following requirements:

6 A. It participates in the statewide assessment program to measure and evaluate the  
7 academic achievements of students; ~~and~~

8 B. It meets the applicable requirements of and has a curriculum aligned with the system  
9 of learning results established in section 6209-;

10 C. It meets health and safety requirements applicable to public schools;

11 D. It accepts any Maine student from a sending school administrative unit; and

12 E. It enters into a contract with every sending school administrative unit of a student  
13 who is attending the private school.

14 The requirements of this subsection apply only to a school that enrolls 60% or more  
15 publicly funded students, as determined by the previous year's October and April average  
16 enrollment; and

17 **Sec. 2. Application.** This Act applies to school years beginning with the 2022-2023  
18 academic year.

19 **SUMMARY**

20 This bill amends the requirements that must be met by private schools receiving public  
21 funds for tuition purposes.
