An Act to Prohibit the Department of Health and Human Services from Implementing Electronic Visit Verification for Hospice Providers Within the MaineCare Program Unless Mandated by the Federal Government

1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, the Department of Health and Human Services is currently implementing 4 electronic visit verification for hospice providers within the MaineCare program, which is 5 not required under the federal 21st Century Cures Act; and 6 Whereas, many hospice providers are unable to comply with electronic visit verification; and 7 8 Whereas, expanding electronic visit verification to hospice providers increases the 9 administrative burden without consideration for the increased financial cost, with no 10 material impact on fraud prevention or improvement in care for MaineCare members; and 11 Whereas, it is important that the Department of Health and Human Services cease 12 implementing electronic visit verification as soon as possible because residents of the State 13 and their families depend on hospice services for end-of-life care; and 14 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 15 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 16 17 therefore, 18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 19 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-NNN is enacted to read: §3174-NNN. MaineCare hospice electronic visit verification prohibited 20 21 The department may not implement electronic visit verification for providers offering hospice services under the MaineCare program until electronic visit verification is 22 mandated for these services by the Federal Government. 23 24 For purposes of this section, "electronic visit verification" means a system under which 25 visits conducted as part of hospice services are electronically verified with respect to the type of service performed, the individual receiving the service, the date of the service, the 26 location of service delivery, the individual providing the service and the time the service 27 28 begins and ends. 29 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved. 30 **SUMMARY** 31 32 This bill prohibits the Department of Health and Human Services from implementing 33 electronic visit verification for providers offering hospice services within the MaineCare program until electronic visit verification is mandated for those services by the Federal 34 35 Government.
