- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §2102, sub-§2, ¶H, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 670, Pt. C, §6 and affected by Pt. D, §5, is amended to read:

4 H. Coordination and oversight Delegation of patient care services specific nursing 5 activities and tasks to be provided by unlicensed health care assistive personnel. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a nurse in the exercise of professional judgment 6 7 from refusing to provide such coordination and oversight in any care setting. The board 8 shall adopt, pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A, major substantive rules 9 for the application of this paragraph to nursing practice The board shall adopt such rules concerning delegation as it considers necessary to ensure access to quality health 10 care for the patient. Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical 11 rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. 12

13 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §2102, sub-§11 is enacted to read:

14**11. Unlicensed assistive personnel.** "Unlicensed assistive personnel" means persons15trained to function in a supportive role, regardless of job title, to whom a specific nursing16activity or task is delegated. "Unlicensed assistive personnel" does not include certified17nursing assistants or persons employed in practical nursing.

18SUMMARY

This bill amends the laws governing nursing to authorize the delegation of activities and tasks by a nurse to unlicensed assistive personnel. The bill provides a definition of "unlicensed assistive personnel" and requires the State Board of Nursing to adopt routine technical rules concerning delegation as it considers necessary to ensure access to quality health care for patients.
