Any overcompensation may be withheld if authorized under section 635 and any loan or advance against future earnings or wages may be deducted if evidenced by a statement in writing signed by the employee. Whenever the terms of employment include provisions for paid vacations, vacation pay on cessation of employment has the same status as wages earned in accordance with the employer's established policy or practice.'

23 24 25 26 27	This amendment replaces the bill and instead requires that the payment of wages owed to an employee leaving employment be made no later then the employee's nex established payday. This amendment also requires that the payment of vacation pay or cessation of employment must be done in accordance with the employer's established policy or practice.
