Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

30 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft. The amendment implements some of the recommendations of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry January 2023 report, "Findings and Recommendations for Streamlining Permitting New Sources of Water for Irrigation in Maine." The amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to the bill.

The amendment provides a one-time appropriation of \$35,000 in fiscal year 2023-24 in order for the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Maine Land Use Planning Commission to hire a consultant to review and overhaul the current applications to improve water withdrawal permitting.

The amendment establishes and provides ongoing funding for 3 full-time, permanent positions: one within the Maine Land Use Planning Commission; one within the
