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## §1300. Lead Paint Renovation Certification Fund

- 1. Fund established. The Lead Paint Renovation Certification Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established as a nonlapsing fund administered by the department. The fund consists of money appropriated to it by the Legislature from the General Fund and eligible investment earnings from fund assets. The fund must be held separate from all other money, funds and accounts, and all eligible investment earnings from fund assets must be credited to the fund.
- **2. Fund purposes.** The department shall administer the fund to provide grants to up to 250 individuals and business entities each year to offset the costs to those individuals and business entities associated with obtaining certification from the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 745, Subpart E (2016).
- 3. Grants. The department shall establish procedures and criteria for the grant application process, eligibility for grants and the award and use of grants made under this section.
- 4. Rules. The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
