The discriminatory motive of the person in making a false public alarm or report or an aggravated false public alarm in violation of section 509, subsection 1; and' 22 23 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively. 24 25 SUMMARY 26 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill and 27 changes the title. 28 It adds emergency communications centers to the list of organizations that may receive 29 false information during the commission of the crimes of false public alarm or report and 30 aggravated false public alarm or report. 31 It defines "emergency communications center" to mean a state, county or municipal government entity that receives calls by 9-1-1, business lines, radio or other methods 32 33 requesting public service or emergency response from public safety agencies and, as 34 appropriate, dispatches requests to public safety agencies and assists in coordinating the response between agencies and other specialized professionals. 35 36 It removes language in the bill that would trigger the crime of aggravated false public 37 alarm or report if the violation generates an emergency response from a law enforcement 38 officer or agency, firefighter or firefighting agency or any other emergency services 39 personnel. 40 **FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED** 41 (See attached)

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
